- continuing to encourage modes of transport by Directors and staff which minimise environmental impact;
- improving, where possible, energy efficiency in the premises we occupy by adopting low carbon solutions and
- working with others to promote environmental policies.

The Firm's objective is to ensure that our environmental impact is reduced in the future by a continual review with staff and Clients, to ensure that they appreciate the need for the environmental benefits of reducing energy consumption, working in and designing environmentally friendly buildings.

All Staff are actively encouraged to propose suggestions to the Directors regarding any method of working which will enhance the environment.
